Ordinance No. 49, known as the bonding ordinance, was taken up, discussed and passed to its first reading. The purport of the ordinance is the calling of an election, to consider the feasibility of bonding the town for the sum of \$2,500, for the purpose of improving the streets, building a city hall and the purchase of fire apparatus, and refunding of the warrant indebtedness. The money to be derived from the sale of the bonds to be apportioned as follows: Warrant indebtedness, \$1,238.37; Street improvement, \$2,761.63; City Hall, site and fire apparatus, \$1,500.00. Attorney Ogden who drew the ordinance was present, and explained the different features of the same and the necessity for creating certain certain. After some discussion the board adjourned to meet on the following Wednesday night.

Palace Meat Market Expenses.

The Palace meat market, believing that nothing is too good for its patrons, has just completed an up-to-date ice box, for the purpose of handling meats in quantities at all seasons of the year. The box was built by F. W. Hurst, an expert in this line of business. The dimensions of the box are 6x11 in the clear, the capacity is six beefs and other meats in proportion. The box is air tight and its principal feature is that the ice is placed in a crate in the center of the box, and is therefore in the same room with the meat. Forty degrees can easily be obtained in the structure. The cost of the structure was \$300 and the company feels that it will be justified in making the expenditure for its own as well as the public's benefit.

Piping For Water System Arrives.

Ten thousand feet of piping for the mains of the water system arrived yesterday and will be unboxed today. Besides the piping for the mains, a large quantity of other material to be used in the construction of the water plant arrived also. Workmen are now engaged in digging the trenches for the mains, and work will be pushed rapidly. Manager Cochran expects the fittings and hydrants this week and with their arrival all material necessary to the construction of the plant will have arrived. Mr. Cochran thinks that with no bad luck the water can be turned into the system July 1st. This is splendid news to the public, who have never lost faith in Mr. Austin's integrity in the matter, and who view the coming of the water system as the most necessary adjunct to an up-to-date civilization.

State Asylum Seeks to Condemn Indian Land.

A condemnation suit was instituted this week by the directors of the North Idaho Insane Asylum who seek through this process to secure title to certain tracts of land lying in the Ford's Creek section, to be used for farming purposes.

Deputy Sheriff Monroe visited this section this week and served the papers in the case. Those owning land to be condemned are: Susie Moody, J. E. Davis, Mather Cornelius, Frank Teap-it-tilp, John Frank, Anna Corbell, J. Peterson, Its-not-Itah-now-tallst. The land involved amounts to 600 acres and is situated about 3 1/2 miles distant from the asylum grounds.

Word reached here Thursday, from Dr. Givens, at Portland, to the effect that Mrs. Givens had undergone an operation for abscess of the head and that an early recovery is assured.

Whites Must Keep Stock off Indian Reserve

Quite a commotion has been caused of late among the stockmen of this section, by the order issued by the Indian department to the effect that stock belonging to white persons should be immediately expelled from the Indian forest lands. Indian Forest Guard Maynard Brown has written to his superior to see if some way can be arranged whereby the stock of the whites can be allowed to remain on the prohibited lands and the following letter shows the status of the matter as between Mr. Brown and his superior:

Dear Sir:—Your letter of the 27th at hand regarding the white people's stock running on the Indian reservation. I will state that we have no authority to charge the grazing fees nor to collect any. The Indians have the right to run their stock on the reservation, but the white people must keep their off. If they do not do it let me know and we will see what we can do.

Very Resp. JAMES STUART, Forest Ranger.

Mr. Brown is of the opinion that later the Indians will get together and decide on leasing these grounds for stock purposes to the whites. About 2000 acres of this land lies in this vicinity.

Halley's Comet Now Visible From This Valley.

Halley's comet, the most celebrated of history, can now be plainly seen in the morning sky. The celebrated wanderer presents a splendid appearance, and is easily discernible by its size and brilliancy. The head very much resembles an incandescent globe at the distance it now is from the earth. The comet can be seen just over the point of the hill to the south of the LaPorte house. It cannot be seen from the street or the lower end of the valley, but a person taking a position just above the greenhouse of J. M. Bartlett can see it readily above the horizon at 3:15.

Mrs. Kate Walters Gets Damages.

Mrs. Kate Walters, widow of William H. Walters, received word this week from her lawyers in Spokane, that the Washington supreme court, sitting in Olympia, had affirmed the decision of the lower court in awarding her damages for the death of her husband, a brakeman on the Spokane International, killed in a wreck on that road several years ago, by being scaled to death. The court, however, reduced the amount of damages from \$20,000 to \$15,000.
